



SESSION

Next Meeting: Thurs. April 23 @ 7PM



The Elders met on Saturday March 14, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. Rev Jennifer Olson served as moderator. This was a Special Session Meeting for the purpose of decision-making in regards to the Covid-19 outbreak. Pastor Jennifer discussed ways to minimize risk, and discussion was held on if we should suspend or continue worship, meetings and other building uses. Based upon the demographics of our congregation, the session felt it was necessary to suspend worship services through April 5, 2020, as recommended by the Presbytery, to allow social distancing. The Session voted to suspend worship services and all other group gatherings at the church through April 5th.

The Elders met for their regular Session meeting via Zoom on Thursday March 26, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. Rev Jennifer Olson served as moderator. A decision at this meeting was to continue with online services and no activities in the church building until the order to allow gatherings has been lifted by the Governor. The Session will readdress what is in the best interest for our church and congregation at that time. The Finance Committee reported that the online giving option is ready to go. A letter will be sent to all church members regarding this new option.


Volunteers from our church are needed!

BOARD OF DEACONS

Next Meeting: Tue. April 7 @ 5:30PM

The Board of Deacons met at the United Presbyterian Church on March 3, 2020 in the Fireside Room. Mary Ann Irwin, Moderator, opened the meeting with prayer. Corrine Kinney-Mehaffey gave devotions on "The Living Hope," emphasizing our relationship with Jesus, spending time in God's Word, and relying on the Lord's Faithfulness.

The minutes from the February 4th meeting were approved. Congregational Care updates were reported and discussed. Pastor Jennifer led worship and served communion, with Eric Olson, Marilynn Jepsen, Marge Meyer, and Mary Ann Irwin helping at the Reed House, and with Marilynn Jepsen and Mary Ann Irwin helping at the Denison Care Center. Statistics were reported for visits, emails, letters, cards, and rides to church.

"Visitor Mugs" continue to be available. Mugs will be given to first time visitors/prospective members. A few mugs are still available for sale to the congregation at \$5.00 each.

Ideas for projects for 2020 were presented and discussed at the Deacon meeting. It was decided to pursue the following: 1) Trial of selling cards again on Sunday mornings - cards will be set up on cart(s)/table(s) and sold for 50 cents each. 2) "Kleenex Drive" to help provide school classrooms with Kleenex boxes was successful with 52 Kleenex boxes taken to the Denison Middle School. 3) Discussion will continue in April on Care Packages/Kits - for after surgery, illness, etc. Each Deacon is asked to bring a list of items to include. 4) Deacons agree to pursue working with the Mission Committee on mission projects this year.

The meeting adjourned and was closed with the Lord's Prayer. The next Deacon meeting will be on April 7, 2020 at The Manilla Manor (dinner 5:30pm; meeting at 6pm).



Making Donations Using GivePlus Church

Where can I download the GivePlus Church app?

GivePlus Church is available through the App Store and Google Play. Search for "GivePlus Church" to download the app, then be sure to allow access to location services if you'd like to use the app's *Find Churches Near Me* feature.

Is the GivePlus Church app free to use?

Yes! The app is free to download and you are not charged a fee to make donations using the app. Simply search for "GivePlus Church" in the App Store or Google Play to find it quickly.

How do I find my church in the app?

When you open the GivePlus Church app for the first time, you will be prompted to enter the name of the church you want to give to. You can enter as much of your church name as you know, and then select your church from the list. Or, use the *Find Churches Near Me* feature to search for churches in your area. If you cannot access this feature, go to your phone's Settings > GivePlus and allow the app to access your location.

Will I have to search for my church every time I want to donate?

No. After you select a church, it automatically becomes your "home" or "default" church. The next time you open the app, the church you last selected will already be displayed.

What payment methods can I use to donate?


GivePlus Church donations can be made with all major debit/credit cards currently accepted by your church. Use your phone's camera to quickly scan your card information or enter it manually. You can also give or pay using your checking or savings account.


Go to the App Store or Google Play and search for "GivePlus Church" to download for FREE.


