

## We're Getting our Website Updated!



Next Meeting: Thurs., Aug. 27 @ 7PM

The Elders met via Zoom on Thursday July 23,2020 at 7:00 p.m. Rev. Jennifer Olson served as moderator. The Session voted to approve the use of our church building for the Hunger Fighters food distribution. Hunger Fighters has been using the elementary school as a distribution point since April. The Siouxland Food Bank will drop off the food at the church and volunteers will sort into boxes. Volunteers will then deliver the boxes to families that drive up. The Session felt like this was a good way for our congregation to become more involved in the local community.

The COVID-19 Task force reviewed the current status of active cases in Crawford County. At this time, the criteria for reopening the sanctuary has not been met. The Task-force is closely monitoring the reports to see when reopening is possible.

The Deacons reported on a project to help TAP (Temporary Assistance Program) restock items for community need. The Worship Committee reported that communion will be held via Zoom on Sunday August 2, with bread being provided.

#### LETTER TO CONGREGATIONS

Dear Church Family,

July 31, 2020

UPC Denison will be holding "Lawn Chair Church" on Saturday evenings at 7:00 pm (weather permitting) in the shady lawn by the Church parking lot. Unfortunately, neither the Sanctuary or the UPC Denison church building can reopen at this time.

Now for the details to explain how we can make this announcement...

Over the last several weeks a return to church "Covid 19 task force" has been meeting about once per week. The task force includes Pastor Jennifer, Shar, Rosemary and Bill. Work has included a review/discussion of the Covid 19 published literature and case data for Crawford County. Our Presbytery has been a key resource in access to guidance for the safe return to services in the UPC Sanctuary and subsequent expansion of service to the full utilization of our building.

On June 25<sup>th</sup> at the monthly Session meeting the COVID-19 Task force recommended specific criteria for a conditional re-opening the Sanctuary, and also for a conditional re-opening the rest of the church building.

The COVID-19 Task force provided specific guidelines for operation when opening such as: wearing a mask; walking one direction in and out; a stationary offering plate; ushers to open doors and direct people, etc. At this time an unconditional (as it was before COVID-19) re-opening is not proposed. Church services will continue to be available online via Zoom, Facebook, YouTube, etc.

A motion was passed to re-open the sanctuary and the building when the following is met:

<u>Sanctuary Reopening:</u> Using the state of Iowa Covid 19 published data for Crawford County the sanctuary would reopen IF the total number of (positive) cases over the prior 15 days was less than 50 for a continuous 15-day period.

**Building Reopening:** Using the state of Iowa Covid 19 data for Crawford County the entire building would reopen IF the total number of (positive) cases over the prior 15 days was less that 5 for a continuous 15 day period.

Both would include the latest recommendations concerning wearing a mask, walking in one direction, a stationary offering plate and enhanced use of ushers to make sure everyone was attending was educated and supported to follow reopening criteria. It was noted that with current CDC recommendations a total of 45 "households" would be the capacity of the sanctuary to enable us to maintain physical distancing.

In addition, the Session approved the purchase of an FM transmitter and related sound system to enable outdoor services to be held with a total cost not to exceed \$600. This would be funded with the \$17,000 support we have recently received through the Federal Payroll Protection Program (PPP Program). The task force and Session were grateful to have the PPP Program funds to support this expense, as well as the qualified expenses related to labor and utility costs of UPC Denison.

#### LETTER continued...

To say the least, this is disappointing news! As such, the sanctuary reopening is again in a waiting pattern until we have our criteria met. This is only being done to protect the health and safety of our congregation, both young and old.

Recognizing that holding in building services is a challenge the task force also discussed and received support to hold a Saturday evening outdoor service in addition to the ongoing services via zoom on Sunday mornings. On July 25, we began worship services outdoors. It went very well, with attendance near 30.

Through at least Labor Day weekend, Pastor Jennifer will hold a "Lawn Chair Church" service on Saturday evenings at 7:00 pm. Ushers will be posted in the parking lot to direct those that wish to bring their own lawn chairs and those that wish to remain in their cars to listen in the on their automobile FM radio. The service will be limited to about 30 to 45 minutes. Please keep in mind that you should bring lawn chairs/a blanket to sit on in the grass and grass attendance will require that you wear masks for arrival and departure from the grass seating area.

The UPC Reopening Task Force will continue to meet on a frequent basis to review the latest literature and our local county Covid 19 case data to enable a return to services inside our UPC Denison building as soon as safely possible.

I recognize this is a frustrating time for all of us. As you reflect in prayer please include adding a "verse" to encourage health and tolerance as we travel through this worldwide challenge.


God said, "Let there be lights in the sky." God made two great lights. He made the

#### The Fall of Jericho - Joshua 6
