### Reflections from Pastor Jenn . . . "What's in a Name?"

When a child is born into the world, they are given a name. Their name. Chosen with love and joy for the new life and hopes for their bright future. I spent hours upon hours pouring over baby name books when I was pregnant with my two children. It felt like such an important decision, to give another person the name they will likely carry with them for the rest of their life. Scripture tells us that God knows each of our names. Hear this from the Prophet Isaiah, "But now, says the Lord, Do not fear for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine." (Isa. 43:1). There are more and if you're curious, check out Psalm 139; Jeremiah 1:5; Psalm 91:14; John 10:14, just to name a few. No pun intended.

Our names are important. It means something when someone remembers our name, knows our name, calls us by name. It shows respect and recognition. You are acknowledging the value and worth of someone by using their name.

But what happens when someone has a name that we don't know or recognize and have no idea how to pronounce? As our world expands and becomes more accessible to everyone, we are coming into contact with more people from other cultures. People with "funny" names. Names we don't know how to pronounce. It's happened to me more than once and I bet it has to you too: I meet someone for whom English is a second (or third) language and when we're introduced and they tell me their name, it doesn't register in my brain. It's not a white Anglo-American name like David or Emily (my kids' names). So what do you do in that situation? Do you repeat it back and ask if that's how to say it? Or do you nod your head while saying, "It's nice to meet you," and hope you don't have to remember it?

Recently on Twitter, a mom wrote of her son, was getting an award in school. He was in 5<sup>th</sup> grade and had been at that school for 5 years. When it came time to give him his award, the teacher presenting it got through his first name and when she saw his last name threw up her hands and pushed the award to another teacher saying, "I can't pronounce that! You do it!" He had a "difficult" name to pronounce. His mother wiped away her tears as she took her son home that day. He wanted to know why they couldn't say his name. Don't they like me, he cried?







### What is Per Capita?

Per Capita is a fundamental way in which all of the nearly 10,000 congregations and mid—councils of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) connect, participate and share in the work of the wider church. Per capita is the primary source of funding for the Office of the General Assembly, and is how Presbyterians mutually and equitably share the costs of coming together to discern the Spirit's leading for the future.



It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the wider church by serving on General Assembly committees and commissions, regardless of distance or financial resources.

It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation" (Book of Order, G-4.0101)

All Presbyterians are called to take part in the ecclesiastical and administrative work shared by the whole church though per capita giving. The annual rate is a per-member apportionment that is assessed biennially by the General Assembly. (Book of Order, G-3.0106)

All congregations — large and small — are encouraged to participate, either through an annual budget item or through a special direct appeal to their congregations. (from <a href="www.pcusa.org">www.pcusa.org</a>)

Consider giving your per capita gift separately from your regular offering. By making this simple offering of \$42.48 specified for per capita, it frees up that money from the general budget. It can really make a big difference in the church's budget!

The gates of **Jericho** were shut tight and guarded closely because of the **Israelites**. No one went out. No one came in.


